These books provide a wealth of information of the experiences your child receives out of school, new learning that has been demonstrated at home and a lovely journey of your child’s development across their first year in school. These books greatly contribute to your child / children’s assessments across the seven areas of learning. Please remember that these books need to show a variety of learning and experiences not just writing and numbers and should primarily be produced by parents not the children themselves. Some ideas of what could be included would be your child riding their bike, digging, planting, cooking, trips out, using tools, family gatherings, art and craft, building models, cultural events, investigating and exploring magnetic materials, floating and sinking, sorting fruits and vegetables, exploring freezing and melting, Christmas fun etc. The possibilities are endless! Any problems please speak to Mrs Day or Miss Man. If you need another book, just let one of us know.</p> <p>Whilst resting over the Christmas period, please could we ask you to capture a WINTER SCENE with a photograph or magazine picture. We will be learning more about the seasons after Christmas and comparing Autumn to Winter. The Winter scene could be frost in the garden, ice on car windows in the morning, snow (if we are lucky) on the trees, snowmen, temperature on a thermometer or simply someone dressed ready for the cold weather...lets be creative! The photos will be used to aid discussion and then displayed on our Winter board.</p> <p>Please note that story books have now been collected in but your child’s reading book will remain with you over the Christmas period. After Christmas, we will not be sending out story books as every child will have a reading book to read at home.
