<p><b>EARLY YEARS CLASS: CHEETAHS</b></p>  <p><b>EARLY YEARS CLASS: LEOPARDS</b></p> 	<p>Happy New Year! The Early Years Team would like to thank you all for your Christmas gifts; we were touched by your generosity. As the cold weather is now upon us, please could all children practise doing their own coats up. Zips can be very tricky for little hands, but this is something that we are working on in school to promote independence.</p> <p>Please could you ensure that all Winter pictures are in by Monday 15<sup>th</sup> January and Learning Journey Books are in by Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> January. This term our topic is Winter and cold climates. If anyone has any things that would support this topic (books, penguins, polar bears) please feel free to send them in. These things would be great for speaking and listening opportunities during Show and Tell.</p> <p>In phonics we will be focusing more on using Red Words in our writing, could you please help your child/children to learn these at home: the, she, he, I, my, was and there. In Maths we will be introducing addition, if there are any opportunities to add or count out different quantities at home this will support your child with their learning (remember to record any evidence in your Learning Journey Book).</p> <p>Please could we ask that your child has only one small key ring on their book bag as they become tangled and children are finding it difficult to collect their book bags independently. Thank you for your ongoing support.</p>
<p><b>YEAR 1 CLASS: TIGERS</b></p> 	<p>We hope that you had a fun and relaxing Christmas break. The children have settled back into the school day very well and we have had a great week of learning. The Year 1 team would like to say a heartfelt thank you for your exceedingly kind and generous Christmas gifts and for the lovely cards that we received; they are greatly appreciated.</p> <p>Your child may have come home mentioning our new book for this term: Traction Man. The children are very excited about this book, so if you are ever in the library they might like to choose some other books by the author Mini Grey.</p> <p>Thank you for continuing to read with your child as practising their phonic skills and comprehension at home makes an enormous difference to their learning.</p> <p>In Maths we have been looking at number bonds to 10, working out all the different ways to make 10, such as 8+2, 0+10 etc, and some children have been working out which number pairs make 20. Any additional practice of these number bonds to 10 will help them to develop instant recall of these.</p> <p><b><i>Please note that your will need you PE kits on Mondays and Fridays this term but it would be helpful if they were on your peg all week just in case!</i></b></p>
<p><b>YEAR 2 CLASS: PUMAS</b></p> 	<p>It sounds like everyone had a fantastic Christmas and New Year and we are looking forward to a fun-packed and hard-working 2018. To start the year we have been working really hard in Maths as we start our Multiplication and Division topic. Every time the children hear the James Bond theme tune they know that it's 2x table chanting time, but any extra practise at home to recall the two times table would be beneficial as we will be starting a regular times table and number bond test.</p> <p>The children have also enjoyed beginning our new topics on 'Living Things and Their Habitats' and 'Magical Maps' - where Mrs Randall's spacial awareness has been put to the test as the class mapped out the school grounds.</p> <p style="text-align: right;"><i>(continued overleaf)</i></p>

	<p>We also had a fire safety talk where the children listened attentively and asked some really probing questions too - they may be checking your homes for working smoke detectors.</p> <p>Finally we began our gymnastics topic and the children loved travelling on the 'big' equipment. Please could all children make sure that they have outdoor and indoor PE clothes and where girls are wearing tights, a pair of spare socks would be beneficial.
