<p>EARLY YEARS CLASS: CHEETAHS</p>  <p>EARLY YEARS CLASS: LEOPARDS</p> 	<p>We have had a very exciting week this week and have enjoyed being mini scientists! We have been mixing lots of different liquids such as Cola, muddy water, milk and apple juice with oil, to see what liquids mix together and which liquids stay separate. Be sure to look at our Early Years blog to see all the pictures!</p> <p>We have also been drawing penguins and then making them waterproof by using wax crayons. We then sprayed them with a lot of water to test our predictions. Please ask your child what they found out!</p> <p>Next week we will be learning all about Chinese New Year. It is so important for children to understand that there are many different people in our world who all celebrate and enjoy different festivals, customs and traditions. It is the Year of the Dog, so if you would like to help your child/children research Chinese New Year, that would be beneficial to their learning. We will continue to learn more letter sounds and will aim to cover v, w and y. We are writing a lot more sentences now, really using our sounds independently to produce slightly longer sentences.</p> <p>In Maths, we will continue to use our addition skills to solve simple problems. The children are being encouraged to explain their thinking (reasoning) and show their workings with objects or by drawing simple pictures.</p> <p>Please keep encouraging your child/children to read their book a few times a week. It really makes a big difference to the amount of progress they make with their reading as well as improving their level of confidence.</p>
<p>YEAR 1 CLASS: TIGERS</p> 	<p>This week the children have had a lovely time showing their favourite toys and talking about the materials from which they are made. We have been finding out about what type of toys children played with in the past and we will be learning some playground games. In English we have created our own superheroes and written about them. We have been focussing on subtraction in Maths and the children have been developing their reasoning and problem-solving skills through word problems. Thank you for continuing to read with your child as this helps them to access other subjects too.</p>
<p>YEAR 2 CLASS: PUMAS</p> 	<p>This week we have started our new unit on statistics. The children thoroughly enjoyed listening to some chosen songs and using a tally to record how many times certain lyrics could be heard. In groups the children also created their own pictograms after surveying the class. Keep learning your 2 times tables - you're all doing so well!</p> <p>In DT this week we have worked on our tables to design some bunting. Yes, Year 2's will be impressing us over the next 2 terms with their sewing skills!</p> <p>We have also continued to plan sequences in gymnastics that contain a clear start, travelling in different ways, a balance and a clear end. We have loved performing these to music and evaluating each group's sequence.</p> <p>Keep checking out our Blog for the wonderful pieces of homework that has been shared so far - don't worry, you still have till the end of term to share yours. And well done to all the Pumas who have been working hard to complete their Athletics tasks. Keep it up!</p>

<p>YEAR 3 CLASS: JAGUARS</p> 	<p>The children have really enjoyed looking at the work of British artists this term, our Gainsborough class masterpiece is coming together nicely and this week we began to explore memory postcards based on the work of Sonia Boyce. Such creative Jaguars! They have been working really hard with written methods of multiplication and using speech punctuation this week. I was really impressed with the positive attitude towards the Spelling Bee competition where a fair amount of house points were earned!
