<p>EARLY YEARS CLASS: CHEETAHS</p>  <p>EARLY YEARS CLASS: LEOPARDS</p> 	<p>Could all Learning Journey books be in school no later than Monday 14th May please. We use this evidence to contribute to each child's final assessments. These books will then be returned to you to keep.</p> <p>We have been learning a range of different letter sounds across the Read, Write, Inc phonic groups when teaching children to read and write. These letter sounds include ng, nk, sh, ch, th, ee, ay, igh, and ir. Please be sure to ask your child all about their learning at school and get them to show you their lovely sentence writing!</p> <p>In Maths we have been learning all about measuring length. We have designed our own giant's footprint from the story of Jack and the Beanstalk, and have been measuring the length of them using non-standard measures. Next week, we will work out the difference in length between our own footprints and those of our giants!</p> <p>We have all had very green fingers this week and have been busy germinating different seeds and then transferring them into our growing area outside. So far we have been growing Runner Beans, Sunflowers and a range of different herbs. We have also begun planting some cucumber seeds, tomato seeds and flower bulbs. There is no stopping us now!</p> <p>Please could all children bring a named sun hat to school when the weather is hot and sunny and please don't forget to smother them in sun cream before school to help keep them safe in the sun when they are playing outside.</p>
<p>YEAR 1 CLASS: TIGERS</p> 	<p>The children have loved being in the sunshine in the outside area this week. We are digging over the garden and learning which plants we need and which weeds need digging out. We have planted some pea seeds and the children are taking good care of them, making sure they have enough water. If you have any spare gardening equipment, such as trowels, compost or seeds, or old pans, mixing bowls etc for our mud kitchen, we would be most grateful for them.</p>
