









<p><b>YEAR 1A CLASS: TIGERS</b></p>  <p><b>YEAR 1B CLASS: LYNX</b></p> 	<p>We have had a lovely week in Year 1 and the children have wowed us with their understanding of 'one more' and 'one less' in Maths. Next week we will be developing our understanding of 'greater than', 'less than' and 'equal to'. We will be starting our new book, but the children will find out what it is as a "slow reveal" as this approach develops their literacy skills. It is delightful to observe all the children during outdoor learning sessions, especially the way in which they treat all creatures with care and respect. Well done Year 1 children!</p>
<p><b>YEAR 2 CLASS: PUMAS</b></p> 	<p>We've had a busy week preparing for our flight to Kenya. The children displayed their creative skills by spending an afternoon recycling cardboard boxes and making props for our flight. We've had suitcases made, cabin crew badges and inflight entertainment all crucial for our flight that we took on Friday.</p> <p>In Maths we have been practising counting in 2's, 5's and 10's and have loved dancing away and singing whilst practising these skills. If the children could continue to practise recalling these at home, that would be brilliant.</p> <p>This week we also started our rotational PE lessons with Year 3. The sports offered for the next three terms are Football, Hockey and Yoga and each term the children will get to experience a different sport. Could we please ask that if your child is currently doing hockey that they bring in some shin pads and a gum shield if they have them - thank you.</p> <p>Please remember to name all jumpers, fleeces and cardigans and to bring in a bottle of water. Learning can be thirsty work!</p>
<p><b>YEAR 3 CLASS: JAGUARS</b></p> 	<p>This week the children have been designing their own Seawigs which we will start making next week. If they want to bring in any extra pieces for this they are welcome to - check their contact books for some ideas. Can they tell you what a Seawig is?!</p> <p>The Jaguars really enjoyed their PE rotations this week, engaging in either football, hockey or yoga. Could we please ask that if your child is currently doing hockey that they bring in some shin pads and a gum shield if they have them - thank you. I was also really impressed with their gymnastic skills on Monday where they currently have the opportunity to work with a PE teacher from The Lenham School; we witnessed some very creative balances!</p> <p>Wednesday is European Language Day and the children will get to experience a range of activities during the day based on different European countries.</p>
