You are also welcome to join your child for a **birthday lunch**. As the school grows we are beginning to stagger lunchtimes for each year group. This does mean that we can no longer remove an older or younger child from class to join their sibling. You will, however, be able to join them separately on their birthday.

For children in YR, Year 1 and Year 2 meals are free. Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 are £2.20 and adults £2.50. All meals include the salad bar, homemade wholemeal bread, dessert or cheese and biscuits.

<p>EARLY YEARS CLASS: CHEETAHS</p>  <p>EARLY YEARS CLASS: LEOPARDS</p> 	<p>This week we have been learning to form the letter 'a' and working hard to write the number 2 correctly. Please practise as much as you can with your child as it really makes a big difference to their learning. The next sound that we will be learning will be 'm' and we will be working our way through the numbers to 10, learning how to form them correctly.</p> <p>Please can we also add the toy request from last week and say thank you to Mrs Turner for the lovely dolls house which has been given to Year 1 children but we still do need another wooden dolls house if any one has one to donate.</p> <p>Could you return your weekly menu on Monday and have a chat with your child this weekend about what they will be eating over the forthcoming week. Thank you.</p>
<p>YEAR 1A CLASS: TIGERS</p>  <p>YEAR 1B CLASS: LYNX</p> 	<p>Thank you for all the home reading you are doing with your child(ren) - it has a huge impact on their learning and helps to build their reading confidence. We will be sending home copies of any new sounds that have been covered in Read Write Inc sessions and if you could go over those at home, it will help to make them very secure. You might like to make some flashcards of the words on the sheet that feature the grapheme (the way the sound is written), or see if your child(ren) can remember how to spell the words. In Maths next week we will be exploring ordering numbers and using ordinal numbers such as 1st, 2nd and 3rd. If you're feeling fit and active perhaps you could have some races and get the children used to hearing ordinal numbers in real life situations; we can't wait to hear all about this from the children! Please can you make sure that all water bottles and clothing are named so that we are able to match any stray items with their owner. The Year 1 team wishes you a very happy weekend.</p>
<p>YEAR 2 CLASS: PUMAS</p> 	<p>The children embraced European Day of Languages and loved experiencing a lesson in an Italian themed classroom and then the rest of the day with Spanish themed lessons. They became Pablo Picasso artists and then collage making Guadi. What a creative day we had!</p> <p>In English this week the children have been working in pairs to re-create the story of 'Lila and the secret of rain' in their own zig zag books. In Maths we have started our unit on adding and subtracting and have enjoyed using different manipulatives to help us. The children have even used the bar method approach to use the inverse to check their calculations.</p> <p>As the weather starts to get colder and wetter can we please ask that the children bring in a pair of named wellie boots that can then be stored on our wellie rack.</p> <p>Have a great weekend Puma Families.</p>

<p>YEAR 3 CLASS: JAGUARS</p> 	<p>It's been a very creative week in Year 3, from making Marshmallow Pops as part of the children's work with instructional writing to creating their very own Seawigs to take to the Night of the Hallowed Shallows! They also embraced our European Languages day with their usual positive attitude and enthusiasm. Well done Jaguars.</p> <p>Could we ask for the children to bring in a pair of named wellies please, this will mean they will be able to enjoy the extra space of the playing field for longer as the weather starts to change.</p> <p>We have had some really impressive Home Learning coming into class so far, thank you for the time and effort you and your children put into these activities, the children really do enjoy showing their achievements to us all. Mathletics passwords have been changed, these are stuck onto the inside cover of the blue contact book and I will set weekly activities for the children to complete linked to the work we have looked at in class.</p>
<p>YEAR 4 CLASS: JUNGLE CATS</p> 	<p>Here we are half way through our first term! Things are really getting into motion in the classroom and we have been learning lots about Romans and we are very close to finishing our first book of the term (the number of activities in between has been very enjoyable)! I do hope home reading is getting along swiftly and I have seen some fantastic homework already. The next week we will continue our work on Romans and hopefully start a new book with new activities for English. Alongside this, we will be looking at six times tables so these would be really great to be prepared for. Another quick reminder those participating in hockey need to bring in their gum shield and shin pads on Monday. Those without will have to be given a different activity to participate in. Here is to another great week.</p>
