<p><b>INDEPENDENT CATERING</b></p>	<p>Christmas Lunch will be served on Friday, 14 December which is also Christmas Jumper Day. <b>All children will be added for a Christmas meal unless you let the office know otherwise.</b> You will find the menu attached to the Headlines email.</p> <p>Lots of children enjoyed a splendid Jungle Lunch on Thursday and the kitchen staff had fun decorating the servery and hall too!</p> <p>You are welcome to join your child for a <b>birthday lunch</b>. As the school grows we are staggering lunchtimes for each year group. This does mean that we can no longer remove an older or younger child from class to join their sibling. You will, however, be able to join them separately on their birthday. Please book online via scopay.com and let the office know which day you will attend with your meal choice. <b>Payments for parent lunches</b> should be made via the 'parent lunch' option on scopay.com and not into the child's account. Click the drop down box to the left and select how many meals you wish to pay for. Likewise with 'sibling lunch'.</p> <p>For children in YR, Year 1 and Year 2 meals are free. Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 are £2.20 and adults £2.65. All meals include the salad bar, homemade wholemeal bread, dessert or cheese and biscuits.</p>

<p><b>SPORT</b></p>	<p><b>Basketball Play-Offs – Wednesday 28<sup>th</sup> November</b>  Our brave Basketball Team took part in the Maidstone School’s play-off this week to decide who would go through to represent the area at the Kent School Games later this year. This event was held at Maplesden Noakes School and Headcorn were joined by the winner and runner up of the other Maidstone group. These schools included Palace Wood, St Michaels and East Borough.</p> <p>The standard of Basketball certainly went up a few notches and all the games were very tough and quite physical and below is a list of results from the event. At the end of the tournament Headcorn finished in 4<sup>th</sup> place. This means that we are considered the fourth best basketball team in the whole of Maidstone, which includes approximately 50 schools from the area. <p><b>YEAR 2 CLASS: PUMAS</b></p> 	<p>It was lovely to see so many of you at the TLC's this week and I look forward to seeing more of you next week.</p> <p>This week the children have been refining their fine motor skills by taking part in some hand exercise and making some Hama bead decorations and jewellery. In Maths this week we started our new topic on Multiplication and Division. The children have been recognising equal groups as well as making groups equal. We are continuing to learn the 10 times table till the end of the term and then we will be moving onto the 2 times table. In English we have been discussing the key events in Halibut Jackson and creating an emotion graph reflecting the changes in his feelings during the key events.</p> <p>Next week we will be doing our first RSE session on 'Differences.' We will also be practising our Nativity performance in preparation for the shows. Please can we remind all children to have their costumes in by Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> December and to let us know if you have any problems sourcing these.</p> <p>Have a great weekend!</p>
<p><b>YEAR 3 CLASS: JAGUARS</b></p> 	<p>What a packed week in year 3 it has been! In maths we have been busy applying our understanding of multiplication and division to solve worded problems and, as predicted, there were plenty of Mathematics certificates to hand out this week. Well done Jaguars! The children have further explored our book, 'The Pebble in my Pocket' by creating a story map to plot the journey of a pebble from millions of years ago, they have used these to create some fantastic written descriptions of its journey. They enjoyed preparing lines to share in assembly.</p> <p>We have been really impressed with how well they have been doing with learning the words and actions for our upcoming Nativity; we have also had a steady stream of costumes arriving in school, thank you very much for these, please make sure they are in all in school by Monday, 3<sup>rd</sup> November and in named carrier bags.
