<p>Head's Lines</p> 	<p>It is unbelievable that we are in the last week of Term 4 already! This has been such a busy term that it has sped by at a rate of knots however it has been packed with lots of fantastic experiences and learning opportunities. Another of these is happening on Monday!</p> <p>The Fantastic Fred Experience is coming to our school! This is part of the Good Mental Health Matters campaign, launched in 2016, to help raise awareness of mental health among young people in Kent, and equip children at a very early age to improve their lifelong emotional resilience.</p> <p>The 'Fantastic Fred Experience' is a live, interactive and educational mental health resource delivered in a touring, pop-up inflatable classroom. During each 30 minute performance, Fantastic Fred will teach children in Years R to 6 simple and memorable ways to look after their mental health - with the letters in Fred's name representing the areas of educational focus:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Food - Eating the right foods • Rest - Getting enough sleep • Exercise - Being active • Digital - Managing time spent online. <p>Please ensure that you talk to your children about what they have learnt from this experience. Mental health, anxiety and pupil wellbeing is really important to us all. We want to follow this up next term through assemblies, PSHE lessons and partnership with parents and carers through a variety of adult education sessions being held at school during the Summer terms.</p>

<p>Y6 TRANSITION TOP TIPS FOR FAMILIES</p>	<p>Week 1</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Can they perform self-help skills that they would be expected to do at secondary – tie a tie? Tie shoe laces? • In the community - do they go out alone? Do they handle money? Have they ever travelled by bus or train? Look out for any community events at your child's new school – check the school website and local press. • You may be asked to sign a weekly homework diary – try to get into the habit as many secondary schools have sanctions for students who forget to ask their parents to do this. • Ask who else is going to the same school and encourage friendships – these may not be the children your child usually hangs out with but it is always good to have a familiar face in the first few weeks. Remind your child that they will make new friends when they start their new school.

<p>EARLY YEARS CLASS: CHEETAHS</p>  <p>EARLY YEARS CLASS: LEOPARDS</p> 	<p>This week we have been finishing our Penguin topic, ready to start learning all about Easter and Spring next week. We will be telling the Easter story and explaining the true meaning of Easter. Of course for 4 and 5 year olds, Easter is all about that special bunny who hides chocolate eggs for them to find but the true meaning will also be explained and the children will be learning that Easter is all about celebrating new life. The children have really enjoyed the Blue Penguin topic and have produced some super independent work which hopefully you saw in their books at your child's TLC.</p> <p>We would like to thank everybody who attended the TLCs as this was a great opportunity to develop partnerships in order to work together to ensure that your child receives the very best start to their education in Reception and to know how you can support their learning at home. It really does make a huge difference when a child is encouraged at home with their learning.</p> <p>The letter sounds that we have learnt this week include qu (queen and her umbrella), x and ng (thing on a string). We have also spent some time recapping the sounds sh (snake and the horse), ch (caterpillar and the horse) and th (tower and the horse). These digraphs are quite difficult for children to remember and spot in words that they are reading. We call them special friends and both of the letters need to stand together and hold hands to make the new sound.</p> <p>In Maths we have started to learn all about 2D shapes. We have been spotting different flat shapes around the environment and describing how many sides (straight or curved) they have and how many corners we can see. We have also made some super shape penguins by using circles, squares, triangles, rectangles, hexagons, pentagons and octagons. The children then labelled their penguin to say what shape they chose to use.</p> <p>Please could we ask for all menu choices to be returned each Monday to school so that we know what your child would like for lunch. Also, as we will shortly be entering Term 5, please ensure that your child knows each morning what they are having for their lunch so that they can answer the lunch register and be more independent.</p> <p>Journal Books- A number of parents have asked when their child's Journal book, which was issued at the beginning of the school year, will be collected in. Please don't panic over this learning log but if all books could be updated (or even started) over the Easter holiday and be sent into school within the first week back in Term 5, that would be super. We use these Home Learning Journals to contribute to each child's final assessment records. In Early Years it is crucial that 'Parent Voice' and 'Child Voice' are both included when making judgements about your child's learning. These books are to be completed by parents and are a record of the lovely things that your child can now do. They might consist of photographs, your child's work, pictures, writing etc. Please remember that there are 7 areas of learning in Early Years consisting of Language and Communication (talking and expressing themselves), Literacy (Reading and Writing), Personal, Social, Emotional Development (getting on with others), Understanding the World (Science), Expressive Arts (creative skills), Physical Development (pencil control and large movements such as riding bikes and climbing) and Maths (numbers, shapes and measures) so everything and anything can be added and will support at least one or more areas of learning. If there are any problems, please speak to myself or Miss Man.</p> <p>Finally we would like to wish you all a lovely Mother's Day. You will find a Mother's Day card made by your child in their book bag. Have a lovely restful day!</p>

<p>YEAR 1A CLASS: TIGERS</p>  <p>YEAR 1B CLASS: LYNX</p> 	<p>Our potatoes are now planted outside our classrooms and we are waiting to see what happens next. We are writing potato diaries about what we observe. We have also been finding out about food chains and trying to work out where the bee from our story would fit into a chain. We had fun using our art and DT skills to create a hanging food chain mobile. Thank you for all your wonderful designs on the egg heads. We have sown our cress seeds and will watch to see if the heads grow cress hair! The children have become art historians, learning about Monet's life, paintings and style, and trying to create our own Springtime blossom pictures in a similar way.</p> <p>Next week we will be having a picnic on Wednesday as we are learning about healthy eating and sensational salads. The children will be making their own sandwich, so please could you send in (in a named bag/box), two slices of bread, a few salad ingredients, and a slice of cheese or ham if your child likes these. Please send in items that the children can cut easily with a table knife. We will supply spreadable butter or margarine, but if your child has an allergy to dairy spreads, please supply an alternative. Because our story is set in France, and the main character takes a croissant on her adventure, we will treat the children to a croissant at the end of our picnic. Please let us know if you would prefer your child not to have a croissant.</p> <p>On Wednesday we will be covering our next RSE topic. In Maths we will be working on counting in 2s and 5s, so please practise these at home.</p>
<p>YEAR 2 CLASS: PUMAS</p> 	<p>We started this week with a non-fiction writing unit looking at features of a non-chronological report and then using the iPads to research an animal to create our very own reports. The children then used all the features that we had identified and their research, to create their own animal fact files. It's amazing some of the facts that they found out.</p> <p>In Maths we started our new unit on Position and Direction and the children have impressed us all so much with their understanding of direction and movement, including quarter turns, clockwise and anti-clockwise.</p> <p>Geography was very exciting this week as we looked at aerial photographs of major landmarks around the world and then tried to identify which continent we would find them in. This was a very challenging task for us all but we were great detectives.</p> <p>Next week we will be learning about Islam in our RE Topic and also covering our second RSE session.</p> <p>Have a wonderful weekend!</p>
<p>YEAR 3 CLASS: JAGUARS</p> 	<p>Year 3 had a great time at The Lenham school for their PE session this week, they were excited to see a different school and represented Headcorn very well. In English the children are still really enjoying exploring The Iron Man, this week they have become roving reporters - ready to write their own newspaper article about the Space-bat-angel-dragon landing on Australia. They have been busy identifying the different features of newspaper recounts and have thought about the ones they can include in their own writing. They also had the opportunity to create their own Iron Man Heads out of clay with some fantastic results! In Maths, I have been really impressed with their work on fractions as they have been working hard to find fractions of different amounts. It has been great to see how much time and effort the children have been putting into Mathletics and Times Tables Rocks, it really helps to boost their confidence in class. Next week we will be looking at our second RSE lesson. I'm on the playground in the mornings if you have any queries.</p>
<p>YEAR 4 CLASS: JUNGLE CATS</p> 	<p>A big thank you to all parents who attended the TLCs this week; it was great to see you all and discuss the progress of the children. A lot has happened in the last few days including looking at multiplication strategies, continuing to read Varjak Paw and exploring Viking lifestyles and homes! We had an excellent time at The Lenham School on Wednesday participating in badminton and were very fortunate to use their facilities (check the twitter page for some photos!).</p> <p>Next week children will be participating in a RSE lesson looking at changes in the human body and what happens when we get older. Next week children will be bringing PE kits home for a wash over Easter and ready for next term. Spellings will be given out at the end of next week for children to look at over the holidays as well to keep them busy! I also wanted to say thank you to all the parents and carers who came to support the football match on Wednesday, a fantastic game and every child played extremely well!</p> <p>I hope everyone has a great weekend and is ready for the final week of term four!</p>
