<p>EARLY YEARS CLASS: CHEETAHS</p>  <p>EARLY YEARS CLASS: LEOPARDS</p> 	<p>Another term over and what a fabulous term we’ve had in Early Years.</p> <p>We hope all the Mummy’s liked their Mother’s Day cards and were thoroughly spoilt over the weekend.</p> <p>This week the children have really enjoyed learning about the true meaning of Easter. We have learnt all about the Easter Story and created some fabulous Easter Bonnets for our parade. We have also been on the lookout for signs of Spring, such as buds and blossoms on the trees, daffodils and lambs. We were also very lucky to receive an exciting visit from Fantastic Fred, who taught the children all about how to keep our minds healthy by having a balanced diet, exercise, a good night’s sleep and limiting time on electronical devices, such as tablets. The children thoroughly enjoyed the performance.</p> <p>In phonics we have continued learning the sounds, ng and nk. This has been a really rewarding term as the children are really beginning to apply their knowledge and skills more independently. We will soon be coming to the end of the first set of sounds and will soon be starting to introduce Ditty Books to lessons. Please continue to practise letter formation, reading and writing over the Easter break.</p> <p>In Maths, we have been learning all about 2D shapes and how to subtract by taking away. The children have enjoyed going on shape hunts and using 2D shape to create pictures.</p> <p>Please remember to add to your child’s Learning Journal Book over the Easter break and send back to school in the first week of Term 5. Remember this does not have to be just writing or maths that your child has completed but the experiences your child has had, such as trips to the zoo, swimming lessons, baking or even riding their bikes.</p> <p>We really appreciate the donation from Mrs Young for the donation of a fabulous pirate ship and other toys. <p>Y6 TRANSITION TOP TIPS FOR FAMILIES</p>	<p>Week 2</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • After starting to discuss moving to Secondary schools, you may have seen slight changes in behaviour in some students. Acknowledge that their apprehensions are valid and 'normal', but try to avoid saying "...don't worry" as that is impossible! Perhaps say "...the end of the year can be tricky, but we are here to help you through it" • Encourage your child to have a place to keep school work – they might have two or three different coloured folders for different subjects. Do they have a set space/area/room to complete homework? Discuss with your child what in this area/space would make the completion of homework more agreeable (music/no music; away or close to a window; on their own or in the family space etc)
