<p>Where in the world?</p> <p>Have a look around your house at food, objects, clothes etc., where have these items come from? <i>Is your pasta from Italy? Where was your T-shirt made? Do you have anything you bought on holiday abroad?</i> You can create a table, design a poster (no larger than A3 please), label a map (you know I love a map), it is up to you! <p>Ready steady cook!</p> <p>Have fun in the kitchen and experiment with chocolate! Have a go at making some cereal cakes (e.g. cornflakes/rice crispies), I've attached a simple recipe for you to follow. I'd like you to take photos of each step, and create a poster (no larger than A3 please), using scientific vocabulary to describe what happens at each stage.</p> <p>Information/key vocabulary you could include: <i>solid, liquid, gas, evaporation, melting point, freezing point, boiling point, temperature.</i></p>	<p>Thursday 21.11.19</p>

You should start with: <i>In the distance, faint sounds of life could be heard.</i></p> <p>You can decide which genre of writing you'd like to do, i.e. adventure, fantasy, mystery (suspense) etc., tick when you have included:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 1 fronted adverbial followed by a comma e.g. All of a sudden,/Without warning,/In the blink of an eye, • Powerful adjectives e.g. ran darted/ scared petrified/ happy ecstatic • 2 adverbs (words which describe a verb) e.g. sprinted desperately/ glided majestically/ laughed arrogantly • 1 simile e.g. The glow of the burnt orange sun disappeared as 	<p>Thursday 5.12.19</p>
