Next Week's Curriculum Overview





Year R Cheetah and Leopard Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus

Maths: Learning to recognise and write our numbers. English: Learning to recognise and write 's' and 'd'.

Topic: Getting to know our school community and understanding that we are part of

that community



Year 1 Tiger & Lynx Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus

English: We will be continuing to look at the emotions of the main character throughout the story and creating story maps to show the changes in emotion. Maths: We will be looking at comparing groups of objects as well as numbers using the language: fewer, same, greater than, less than and the same. We will be beginning to look at the symbols for greater than >, less than < and equals =.

Other: In Art, we will be looking at comparing two different pieces of art, considering

colour.



Year 2 Puma & Panther Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus

Maths: We will be comparing numbers using greater than, less than and equal to symbols (>, <, =). We will also be practising to count in 2s, 5s and 10s.

English: Book talk & story -mapping

Other: We will be learning all about nutrition in science.

Computing: It would be great if you could practise your typing at home as this is an important skill and will help us in our computing lessons. You can practise on **BBC Dance Mat Typing.**

Please remember to bring your purple home learning books in every day.



Year 3 Jaguar & Pallas Cat Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus

English: Using adjectives and nouns to describe scenes in our new class text. Maths: Comparing and ordering numbers up to 1000 and using a number line to estimate.

Topic: Learning about the tools invented during the three periods of the Stone Age.



Year 4 Jungle Cat & Cougar Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus

Math: Comparing and ordering numbers to 10000 and introducing Roman Numerals English: Looking at types of nouns and speech; directed and reported speech. Other: In RE we are looking at the 10 Commandments and in History we will be looking at the Anglo-Saxon Kingdoms.



Year 5 Caracal & Snow Leopard Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus

English: in SPaG we will be looking at possessive apostrophes Maths: we will be moving onto rounding numbers to 1,000,000 Music: we are learning our song 'Living on a Prayer' by Bon Jovi



Year 6 Lion & Ocelot Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus

Maths: rounding numbers within 10 million

English: setting descriptions of the slave compound in our book 'Freedom'

Other: continuing to explore the transatlantic slave trade and how it shaped history,

and beginning to explore the structure of the heart in Science.
