Next Week's Curriculum Overview





Year R Cheetah and Leopard Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus

Literacy: We will be learning to read and write the letter sounds 't' and 'i' as well as consolidating 'a', 'm', 's' and 'd' so that children know these letter sounds at speed. It is crucial that children practise this at home as well as practising writing each letter. They will then be ready to move on to the next step in their reading and writing. Maths: We will be learning all about numbers 6 and 7. We will be counting out small sets of objects and learning how to form these numbers probably. Again, this is something that will only get better if it is constantly practised. Topic: Talking about each of our senses and making clay faces.



Year 1 Tiger & Lynx Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus

English: In English this week, we are looking at video clips and documentaries about bears, foxes and birds to further understand what life is like for the main character of our focus text, Wild.

Maths: In Maths we are looking at ordering sets of 3 numbers within 10 from greatest to smallest and smallest to greatest. We will also be looking at a number line, using it to compare and order.

Science: In our human senses topic we will be taking part in a simple investigation testing the functions of our five senses. We will see if we can identify 5 different things we can hear, see, smell and taste in our investigation.





Year 2 Puma & Panther Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus

English: We will be retelling Lila and the Secret of Rain in our words and writing a poem to celebrate the rain.

Maths: We will be learning to count in 3s. We will also be beginning our new unit on addition and subtraction, starting with number bonds to 10.

Other: We will be completing an exercise challenge in science as part of our 'Human Survival' topic and looking at how power and rule have changed over time in History.



Year 3 Jaguar & Pallas Cat Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus

English: Linked to our Topic, The Stone Age, we will write a set of instructions on how to make a weapon and a Bell Beaker Pot from clay.

Maths: Moving onto addition and subtraction where we will first explore adding and subtracting 10s.

Topic: Linked to Art and English we will learn about the Beaker People from the Neolithic Period.

Art: Begin making a Beaker Pot from Clay and develop clay techniques.

Please continue to read regularly at home and fill in the MyHigh5 card within the Home Learning Book.



Year 4 Jungle Cat & Cougar Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus

Maths: Rounding numbers to the nearest 10,100 or 1000

English: Newspaper articles and sentence types.

Other: In RE we are looking at Judaism and in Geography; 6 figure grid references.



Year 5 Caracal & Snow Leopard Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus

Maths: we will be moving onto addition and subtraction

English: we will be continuing with our character descriptions from the book 'Bronze and Sunflower'

Art: in Art, we will be creating our final piece using shades, tones and tints



Year 6 Lion & Ocelot Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus

English: We will be exploring Nat's dilemma in our book, 'Freedom' leading up to writing a balanced argument about whether he should remain in Jamaica and search for his family or seek a new life in England.

Maths: We will be exploring factors, multiples, primes, square and cube numbers. Other: In Science, we will be dissecting a heart to learn more about its structure and function. In Computing we will begin to explore how we can use a Micro:bit to programme an interactive toy.

Please can children bring an old, unwanted toy into school (in a named carrier bag) by Tuesday 26th September. These toys will be deconstructed and re-purposed, so please nothing new, expensive or with sentimental value!
