Dear Parents and Carers



Today we had the first Governor Day of the new academic year. This is a special day when our Full Governing Body comes into school for the whole day to complete Learning Walks, speak to children about their learning, looks at books and speak to teachers and leaders about the curriculum, learning, data, the running of the school and much more!

Here are just some of the comments Governors shared at the end of today:

'We were really impressed with the creative use of classrooms and space across the school. The consistency of what was offered by each pair of year group teachers, their curriculum and the set-up of the classrooms was remarkable. This didn't hinder the individual personalities of the staff shining through or the individual needs of the children being met. There was a reassurance in the similar approaches, vocabulary, pedagogy (teaching styles) and expectations between classes of the same year group but also in the progression between year groups so that children were familiar with routines, language used, expectations of them etc.'

'Children across the school interacted with teaching staff and visitors with confidence and they were keen to share their learning and read to us.'

'In Early Years it was fantastic to see the children taking their classroom learning outside to play. They were practising their letters with chalk on the ground, painting with water, drawing in cornflour, writing on white boards. So much was on offer to extend their learning.'

'A range of aids (writing slope, standing desk, tablet, laptop, modelled writing, paired editing, etc) were being used to engage and extend children in their writing.'

'TAs were being used creatively to facilitate children's learning. They were engaged, well utilised and in many classes, like a double act with the teacher!'

'It was a joy to see OPAL embedded at lunchtime. Such a wide variety of activities provided for children to enjoy their time with their friends, sharing expertise (children in Pony Club were having an in-depth discussion about different types of saddles!), children of different ages playing beautifully with each other, older children supporting younger children, siblings playing together.... all were engaged and happy.'

I would like to take this opportunity to thank our Governing Body for their support and the time they give in this voluntary role to assist in driving the school forward and bringing leadership and accountability. Each member of the board brings such expertise and wisdom. We are very fortunate to have each person invested in our school.

Year R Cheetah and Leopard Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus

Maths: We will be learning about number 10 and counting out small sets of objects, making 1:1 correspondence as we count.

Literacy: We will be learning to read and write letter sounds 'o', 'c' and 'k' and practising blending and hearing the different sounds in words.

Topic: We will be starting our new topic all about the seasonal changes we see and feel in Autumn.

As the weather starts to get cooler and wetter, please could all children bring in a waterproof suit for them to wear out at playtime which will be kept at school. This will help to keep your child dry and their uniform clean from mud. If you haven't already sent in welly boots for your child to wear out at playtime, please send these in ASAP. We are looking at addition problems as well as our number bonds to 10.</p> <p>History: We will be looking at everyday life in the 1950s.</p> |
|  | <p><u>Year 2 Puma & Panther Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus</u></p> <p>Maths: Adding and subtracting ones. Please remember to spend some time on Sumdog to complete the challenges set by your teacher. Remember you can find your login details in your home learning book.</p> <p>English: Writing a persuasive leaflet for a Safari trip!</p> <p>Art & Design: We are going to begin our compositions in art using our knowledge of complementary colours, and focussing on some significant monarchs throughout Britain's history.</p> |
|  | <p><u>Year 3 Jaguar & Pallas Cat Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus</u></p> <p>Maths: Adding two, two-digit or three-digit numbers together using the formal written method and place value charts, across 10 and 100.</p> <p>English: Focusing on developing our comprehension skills and using the text to help us answer questions using inference.</p> <p>Science: We will be investigating the joints within our bodies and how they work through an exciting experiment!</p> |
|  | <p><u>Year 4 Jungle Cat & Cougar Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus</u></p> <p>Maths: Subtracting two 4-digit numbers with no exchange and one exchange.</p> <p>English: Introducing DASH; as we write an action story with Description, Action, Speech and How the character is feeling?</p> <p>Other subjects: Following on from our practical digestion session we will be learning about the different parts of the digestive system. In History we will be looking at everyday life in Anglo-Saxon Britain.</p> |
|  | <p><u>Year 5 Caracal & Snow Leopard Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus</u></p> <p>Maths: Next week we will be moving onto multiplication and division.</p> <p>English: We will be writing our very own stories.</p> <p>Art: We will be creating our final pieces doing a landscape using tints, tones and shades.</p> |
