Next Week's Curriculum Overview	
	Year R Cheetah and Leopard Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus Maths: We will be matching sets of objects to the correct numeral. Literacy: We will be learning to read and write the letter sounds 'u' and 'b' and using them to make words. Topic: Making Halloween potions (science).
	Year 1 Tiger & Lynx Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus Maths: We will be using the directional language of left and right, linking with our geography learning. Please could you practise your left and rights at home. English: We will be looking at the end of the story and comparing our predictions to the events that happen. We will also be exploring our feelings regarding how the story has ended. Computing: We will be learning to program the beebots to move in different directions.
	Year 2 Puma & Panther Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus Maths: We will be adding and subtracting numbers such as 56 + 5 and 16 - 7. We will be discussing the most efficient written and mental methods we could use. Remember to complete work set on Sumdog as this will help consolidate learning that we have done in class. English: An introduction to whole class guided reading and comprehension questions using VIPERS (Vocabulary, inference, predictions, explanations, retrieval and sequencing). We encourage using a similar approach at home when reading with your child to ensure they have understood what they have read: you could try asking simple questions about what new vocabulary words mean, ask them to make predictions about what might happen next, discuss how we know how a character is feeling and encouraging them to summarise the story at the end. Other: Evaluating our final pieces in art and looking at 3 historically significant artists in History
	Year 3 Jaguar & Pallas Cat Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus English: Using their knowledge of our Topic, The Stone Age, and our class text, Stone Age Boy by Satoshi Kitamura, the children will write in role to retell the narrative using expanded noun phrases and fronted adverbials. Maths - subtracting two numbers, adding and subtracting 2 digit and 3 digit numbers. History: The children will use a variety of historical sources to describe life in a Neolithic Stone Age settlement similar to that of the character Om in the class text Stone Age Boy by Satoshi Kitamura. Science: The children will continue to learn about Animal Nutrition and the Skeletal System.
	Year 4 Jungle Cat & Cougar Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus Maths: Efficient ways to subtract and check addition and subtraction strategies. English: Writing Kenning poems and finishing our Guided Reading text of 'The Saga of Eric the Viking.' Other: We have an exciting opportunity where a Humanist will be speaking to the year group and discussing moral problems. In Geography we will be looking at the contrasting climates of North & South America.
	Year 5 Caracal & Snow Leopard Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus Maths: Continuing with multiplication and division. English: We will be continuing to write our story. Music: We will be filming our final rendition of Living on a Prayer!



## Year 6 Lion & Ocelot Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus

Maths: we will be looking at the order of operations and using this knowledge to complete a range of problems.

English: we are continuing our narrative poems.

Other: we will be evaluating our final landscape paintings in Art and carrying out an investigation into how our heart rate affects sprint times in Science.
