You won't believe the crazy digital playground our children are exploring! Yep, they're soaking up content from online influencers like sponges. Now, how do we make sure they're not just blindly following the crowd? Let's unravel this mystery together!

We have found an awesome article on Internet Matters (check it out here:

Then, there's this awesome guide from *National Online Safety*, all about I-N-F-L-U-E-N-C-E-R-S and how they impact our children (we have attached this to Headlines for your info). They spill the beans on potential risks and throw in some real-deal advice to make sure our k have a positive online experience.

Keep the conversation flowing! Ask your children about the influencers they're into, what kind of content they're binging on, and let them spill the tea. The more we know, the better we can guide them through this digital jungle.

Next Week's Curriculum Overview

Year R Cheetah and Leopard Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus

Maths: The activities this week will support children to focus exclusively on the numerosity of sets, without being diverted by colour, shape or size. They will then be encouraged to notice when quantities are equal or unequal, and will begin to consider how they can manipulate the number of objects in 2 sets to make them equal. Literacy: We will be applying our 'special friend' sounds to write a range of simple sentences, introducing capital letters, finger spaces and full stops.

Topic: We will be reading *How to Catch a Star* by Oliver Jeffers and thinking of imaginative ways that the boy could have tried to catch the star.

Year 1 Tiger & Lynx Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus

English: We will be looking at the emotions of our main character Beegu as she has landed on Earth, thinking about her thoughts and feelings and how we know this. Maths: We will be starting our new unit addition and subtraction within 20. We will be looking at the numbers bond within 20, doubles and adding one more.

Computing: In our unit 'We are publishers', we have been creating an e-book. This week we will be adding text to our book and formatting it.

Year 3 Jaguar & Pallas Cat Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus

English: Using the class text, *The Firework Maker's Daughter* as our inspiration, the children will develop their writing skills by using a range of descriptive vocabulary, conjunctions and story mapping.

Maths: The children will begin a unit on **Measure** using cm and mm. We will also begin **Times Table Tests** on a Wednesday each week. You should have received an email regarding this. In summary all children will start on the 2 times table. They will need to get 12/12 for two weeks running before they move on to the next number. Please use Sumdog and Times Table Rockstars to practice at home. Please ask if you need log in details again.

Science: This term our Science and Geography go together in our Topic **Rocks, Relics** and **Rumbles.** This week the children will learn about Fossils in Science and learn about the work of a Volcanologist in Geography.

Art: After designing an ammonite motif the children will investigate different printing techniques culminating in printing their very own t-shirt!

Year 4 Jungle Cat & Cougar Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus



Maths: Dividing 2 and 3-digit number by 1-digit numbers and looking at ways to multiply efficiently.

English: Writing a race programme for The Great North Race.

Other: In Geography we will be looking at topography and how to read contour lines. In Computing we will continue to explore creating music on Garage Band. These websites are also fantastic ways for the children to explore this further if they wish to do so:

Year 5 Caracal & Snow Leopard Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus
