E-Safety Update

This week we wish to bring to your attention the existence of an online platform called **Reddit**, which serves as a vast virtual community where individuals engage in discussions and share a myriad of ideas. As stewards of your children's digital engagement, it is pertinent to address the question of whether your child should be utilizing this platform. **Reddit**, in essence, functions as a digital forum where users participate in conversations organized into thematic sections known as "subreddits." While the platform offers opportunities for knowledge-sharing and community-building, it is important to note that **Reddit** is not explicitly tailored for a younger audience.

Given the wide range of content available on **Reddit**, from educational to potentially inappropriate material, exercising vigilance over your child's online activities is of the utmost importance. If you are contemplating allowing your child access to **Reddit** or if this is something that they are already engaging with, we highly recommend consulting the attached guide to this week's Headlines. This resource provides valuable insights and strategies for navigating Reddit safely.

While Reddit presents an avenue for discovery, the establishment of clear guidelines for your child's online engagement is important. Should you decide to permit your child's exploration of Reddit, open communication is essential in ensuring a secure and enriching online experience.

	Year R Cheetah and Leopard Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus Maths: This week, the children will continue to engage with activities that draw attention to the purpose of counting – to find out 'how many' objects there are. We will also revisit the stable order principle and the concept of cardinality – the idea that the last number in the count tells us how many things there are altogether. Literacy: Using our knowledge of night-time to write simple words and phrases to give Tessy Bear advice on how to get to sleep. Topic: The Moon
