# Year 3 Jaguar & Pallas Cat Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus

Maths: The children will be learning about and investigating Fractions. Times Table Tests are on Wednesday each week. Please ensure that your child brings in their Purple Home Learning Book.

English: We will begin two next Class Texts: The Pebble in my Pocket (The history of our Earth) by Meredith Hooper and The Boy Who Grew Dragons by Andy Shepherd. Across the term the children will work on: Poetry • Descriptive Writing • Story Mapping • Drama • Writing in role • Explanation Writing.

Geography: We will continue learning about Physical Geography within our term long Topic: Rocks, Relics and Rumbles.

Design Technology: **Making it Move** This project teaches children about cam mechanisms. They experiment with different shaped cams before designing, making and evaluating a child's automaton toy.
