Thank you to everyone who attended our Parent Teacher Consultations this week. You will receive a final summary end of year report in July.


This next term we have lots of events coming up including opening the swimming pool for lessons for KS2. (Separate email with information about this.)


- School colour T-shirt with black or navy shorts / skirt

History: In our first week back, we will look at Hadrian's wall and discuss why the wall was built and its significance. In R.E. we will be answering the next question: 'Why do some people think life is a journey?' For the first 2 weeks in Term 6, we will start to showcase our amazing recall of times tables in the MTC's. Please reassure the children that there is no need to panic and the progress that they have made this year, has not only wow-ed us but made us very proud indeed! Year 5 Caracal & Snow Leopard Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus Maths: We will be looking at negative numbers, converting units and volume. English: We will be carrying on reading 'Who Let the Gods Out?' and basing our writing around this starting with newspaper reports. Science: We will be doing human reproduction and aging, which will tie in with our RSE (relationships and sex education) topic in PSHE.
Year 6 Lion & Ocelot Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus Next term, we will be continuing our 'Britain at War' topic, this time focussing on World War II. In DT, we continue a wartime theme as we embark on our 'Make Do and Mend' topic. In Science, we being our work on 'Light Theory'. If your child has come home with a script today, we would love if they could practise their lines for our Y6 production over half term!
