

That's why, in our weekly newsletter, you'll find a section dedicated to e-safety tips to help you and your family navigate the online world with confidence.

This Week's E-Safety Tip: Watch Out for QR Code Scams

You've probably noticed that QR codes are popping up everywhere these days. They're super handy, aren't they? Whether you're scanning a code to pay for something, check a menu, or get more information, it's amazing how quickly they can connect us to what we need. But, like many good things, there's a downside. Some less-than-honest people are using QR codes to trick others into giving away personal information or even payment details. It can be tricky to tell if a QR code is safe, especially when it looks just like any other. That's why it's so important to be aware and know what to watch out for. If you come across a QR code that seems a bit off, or if you're not sure where it came from, it's best to be cautious. Always try to verify that the code is from a trusted source before scanning it. And if a link looks strange after you've scanned the code, don't click on it. Legitimate organizations will never ask for your personal details through a QR code link, so if you see anything like that, it's a red flag.

To help you stay one step ahead, we've attached a detailed guide from National Online Safety. It's full of useful information on how to spot QR code scams and protect yourself from them. We encourage you to take a look and share it with your family, so everyone stays safe.

Year R Cheetah and Leopard Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus

We would like to welcome you to Headcorn Headlines! The children have had a very successful start and have enjoyed their introduction to Early Years over the past four days. We have been carrying out Baseline Assessments which are a statutory requirement and hope to be moving forward onto our first topic of 'Me and My Community', next week. Please could you all send in a photograph of your child with their family as we will be using these to aid discussion. We hope you have a lovely, restful weekend!

Year 1 Tiger & Lynx Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus

Maths: We will be recognising numbers as words and continuing to practise our accurate counting to 10.

Science: We will be making observations about our bodies, counting how many body parts we have and recording them in a table. We will consider why we have two arms, legs, eyes etc and how they help us.

English: We will start to explore our new text, Wild. We will look at the front cover to see what we can infer and make predictions about the story plot.




Year 2 Puma & Panther Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus

English: We will continue to read Lila and the Secret of Rain;

Maths: We will be learning to partition numbers into ones and tens;

Science: We will be learning about human life cycles;



Year 3 Jaguar & Pallas Cat Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus

Maths: We will be looking at representing and partitioning numbers to 1000

English: We will be writing descriptive settings using accurate sentence structure and a range of effective adjectives.

Other: In History we will be starting our new topic, 'Through the Ages' by creating a timeline to really start to understand where The Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age fits in. The children have made a great start already with their French lessons and this week they will be using key greetings, as well as learning how to ask and answer the question 'how are you?'

We wanted to congratulate the children on a great start to Year 3! It is quite a transition from KS1 to KS2 and we have been so impressed with the seamless move and their mature, can-do and hardworking attitude.



Year 4 Jungle Cat & Cougar Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus

Maths: In maths this week we will be looking at place value of numbers up to 10,000 including how they can be represented and partitioned.

English: We will be continuing to explore persuasive letters as we write to Professor Brownstone to select us to visit the family vaults.

RE: In RE we will be exploring how Christian communities use their faith to help them decide between right and wrong.



Year 5 Caracal & Snow Leopard Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus

Maths: next week we will be continuing with place value, looking at powers of ten and partitioning.

English: we will be looking at our new book Mulan in more detail, tying in with our history topic about Ancient China.

Science: we will be looking at the movement of the earth, sun and moon.



Year 6 Lion & Ocelot Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus

Maths – Next week, we will continue developing our knowledge of place value to understand the value of numbers and digits

English – We will begin to write our diary entries in character as Nat, the main character from our class text 'Freedom' by Catherine Johnson.

Geography - We will look at Headcorn as our local settlement and how it has changed throughout the years

Science – We will begin to look at the heart as part of the circulatory system in more detail
