# **Managing Online Conflict: Tips for Parents**

**O**nline disagreements can pop up just as easily as in-person ones. As parents, we want to help our children navigate these situations calmly and confidently. The National Online Safety guide, *which we have attached*, offers some great advice to help manage conflict online in a positive way.

**F**irst, it's important to talk to your child about staying calm when a disagreement happens. It's easy to get swept up in emotions, especially behind a screen, so encouraging them to take a deep breath before responding can make a world of difference. Remind them that it's okay to step away from the screen if things feel heated—sometimes, the best response is no response at all.

It's also a good idea to teach your child the value of kindness. Even if they don't agree with someone, responding politely can help diffuse tension and prevent things from escalating. A little kindness can go a long way in turning a potential argument into a constructive conversation.

**W**hen conflict does arise, encourage your child to speak to you or another trusted adult about what's happening. Whether it's a misunderstanding with a friend or a more serious issue, having that open line of communication can help them feel supported. Also, remind them that reporting inappropriate behavior on a platform is an option, and should always be done when necessary.

At the end of the day, online disagreements are part of growing up in the digital age. By guiding our children with a bit of patience, empathy, and open conversation, we can help them navigate these moments with confidence.

### E- Safety Update - Creating a Safe and Positive Gaming Environment for Children

As many children enjoy playing video games, it's important for parents to create a safe and positive gaming environment. UNICEF offers useful tips for parents to ensure that gaming remains a fun and healthy experience for their kids.

- 1. Set Clear Boundaries: It's important to agree on rules about screen time and content. Use parental controls to monitor the types of games and the amount of time your child spends playing.
- 2. Encourage Age-Appropriate Games: Ensure your child is playing games suitable for their age. Checking age ratings and reading game reviews can help you decide what is appropriate.
- 3. Foster Open Communication: Talk to your child about their gaming experiences. Ask them what they enjoy about the games and discuss any concerns they might have. Encourage them to come to you if anything makes them feel uncomfortable.
- 4. Keep Gaming Social: Playing with friends can be a positive aspect of gaming, helping children learn teamwork and develop social skills. However, be aware of who they're playing with online, and ensure they only connect with people they know and trust.
- 5. Teach Online Safety: Remind your child never to share personal information online, including their real name, address, or school. Also, stress the importance of respectful behaviour while gaming and encourage them to report inappropriate content.

#### Year 1 Tiger & Lynx Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus

Maths: We will be practising counting backwards and finding 1 less than any number within 10.

English: We will be looking at illustrations from our book 'Wild' and will be talking about the emotions of the character.

Geography: We will be drawing maps, adding and labelling different human and physical features.



#### Year 2 Puma & Panther Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus

Maths: we will be learning to count in 10s up to a 100 and identify missing numbers on a number line

Art: we will learn to compare and contrast famous paintings

Science: we will learn about a healthy diet and we will plan our healthy meal





## Year 3 Jaguar & Pallas Cat Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus

Maths: In Maths we will be starting our Addition & Subtraction unit by using our number bonds to add 1's and 10's.

English: In our SPAG lessons we will be looking at imperative verbs. In English we will be studying the features of instructions and using these to write our own instructions using imperative verbs.

Other: In Science we will be setting up our own experiment to explore fatty foods. In PE we will be continuing our hockey unit by practising the defensive pose ready to tackle. If your child could bring in a pair of shin pads and a gum shield that would be great. Thank you!



# Year 4 Jungle Cat & Cougar Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus

English: After some rather dramatic character reports, the children will be writing their own newspaper articles based on the wolfs arrival in the village.

Maths: Next week we will be learning about Roman Numerals and then moving on to rounding to the nearest 10.

Geography: We will be using an Atlas to locate the Tropics of Cancer and Capricorn.



#### Year 5 Caracal & Snow Leopard Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus

Geography: Looking at the human and physical geography of different continents. Maths: Methods for addition and subtraction.

English: We will be editing and publishing our Mulan diary entries. Our goal is to keep our writing informal using contracted forms, describing our thoughts and feelings using chatty vocabulary and punctuate our sentences correctly throughout.

Please can all Y5 children bring in a healthy snack: we cannot guarantee that there will be fruit available at school.



#### Year 6 Lion & Ocelot Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus

Maths: We are moving on to multiplication next week, revising the formal written method for multiplication, before applying our skills to solve a range of reasoning and word problems.

English: We will be continuing our setting descriptions of the slave compound, based on our class text, 'Freedom'.



Other: In Science, we will be learning about the structure and function of the heart with a practical dissection lesson.

History: we explore Ancient African Kingdoms, focussing on the Benin Bronzes.

Art: we will begin to generate our own ideas for our final composition pieces, exploring places that are special to us. With this in mind, by Monday 23<sup>rd</sup>, please could you send in a photo of a place that is special to your child - it could be a landscape, picture of their favourite room in the house, a holiday destination. You can either send in a hard copy, or email this in and we can print it for them.
