Next Week's Curriculum Overview

Year R Cheetah and Leopard Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus

Maths: Subitising (saying how many there are in a small group of objects by 'just seeing' and knowing straightaway without needing to count) and writing numbers correctly. Literacy: We will be learning to read and write the letter sounds t and i.

Topic: Understanding that everyone is unique and has different likes and dislikes.

In Early Years we value the home/school partnership in your child's learning journey. We will be sending home a yellow Learning Journey book for you to complete at home over the course of your child's Reception year. Through this you are able to share with us any new experiences or developmental milestones, such as learning to ride a bike, holding a pencil correctly, going on a trip, writing words or numbers, baking a cake and weighing ingredients, enjoying a celebration etc. This book is completely unique to your

child and you, so there are no rules on what you decide to add or how you present it. We will look forward to you sharing these with us from time to time.

Please encourage your child to use the tripod pencil grip (as shown to the right) when practising writing as this will support correct letter formation.





Year 1 Tiger & Lynx Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus

Maths: We will be comparing objects using the vocabulary of 'fewer', 'more' and 'same' and comparing numbers using the vocabulary of 'greater than', 'less than' and 'equal to' English: We will be continuing to look at the illustrations from our book 'Wild' as the story develops and writing our observations.

RE: We will be looking at what Christians believe about God.



Year 2 Puma & Panther Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus

RE: we will continue to learn how to show care and love to others Science: we will learn about active lifestyle and why it is good for our bodies to keep fit Maths: we will continue to explore learning about numbers within 100



Year 3 Jaguar & Pallas Cat Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus

Maths: We will be learning to add 1's across a 10 and adding 10s across a hundred. We will look out for patterns and think carefully about how to describe them using the correct mathematical vocabulary.

English: We will be looking at expanded noun phrases and looking at features of letters. We will then write a letter using expanded noun phrases.

Other: In PSHE we will be learning why rules are needed and how they relate to rights and responsibilities as well as how to make others feel valued. In RE we will be learning how Christians male a difference in our local community and linking this to the Harvest Festival.



Year 4 Jungle Cat & Cougar Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus

Maths: We will be rounding numbers to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000.

English: Forming our own debate with persuasive arguments.

Other: For art next week we would like to invite children to bring in an interesting object from home. Children will be drawing their object and focussing on colour composition. We kindly ask that children do not bring in any items that are expensive or irreplaceable.







Year 5 Caracal & Snow Leopard Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus

Maths: Log on to Sum Dog and you'll find that a task has been set. It is called 'Place Value: What do we now know?' This will be live from the morning of Friday 27th September.

This will be a helpful review of the learning from out first three weeks in Y5. We are now moving our learning forward to focus on mental and written methods for addition and subtraction. These will be applied across the Y5 Maths curriculum.

English: We will explore how to use metaphors, precise vocabulary and positional words to create detailed setting descriptions.


History: How important was power in the hierarchy of the Shang Dynasty?

Year 6 Lion & Ocelot Classes: Next Week's Curriculum Focus

English: Now that our setting descriptions are done (and looking great!), we'll be moving onto writing narrative poems chronicling Nat's journey to London Maths: We are continuing to focus on multiplication fluency before moving onto problem solving and word problems



Art: We will begin to work on our compositions based on our photos of our special places
